Communication

Open and ongoing communication within the school and between school and home is essential to ensure wellbeing, academic and social success for children. If you have any concerns about your child's schooling, or are aware of issues at or outside of school which may impact on school, please be sure to make a time to discuss these with your child's teacher. Similarly, staff will contact parents to raise issues or concerns as we all have the best interests of the children at heart.

The way children present at school and home can be at times vastly different. Sometimes a student's recall of events varies significantly (or has significant omissions) to reports from staff or other students. I ask that parents and carers continue to support and listen to their children while also supporting the actions of school staff. Most importantly, please contact the staff member involved for clarification or additional information when needed. This way we can all work together to support students to do their best.

The best way to contact the staff member is via the office. If the incident or issue is serious and having a significant impact on your child, let the office staff know of its urgency and they will ensure that I or another member of the executive staff follow up promptly.

Reconciliation Week – Don't Keep History a Mystery (27th May – 3rd June)

I would encourage all families to have a look at the Reconciliation Week website. 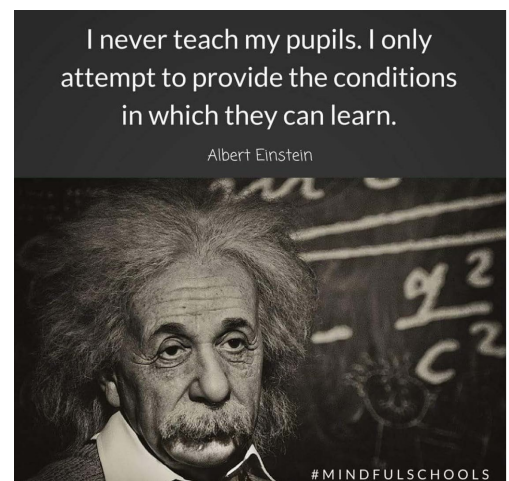

We are happy to announce that the service is steadily growing with more new children in attendance. This however means, that to maintain correct, safe, staffing ratios we ask that you make sure that your children are **booked in at least a day in advance.**

Allergies, Physical, Emotional, Social, Dietary, Learning Needs

New support plans are being rolled out, so that recently registered families with children with additional needs, will be asked to fill in "management plans" for their child's needs so that educators can write up Support plans before the child attends their first session. These then need to be signed by parents and sent to head office for endorsement, so that adequate educator numbers are always present. Families who have been with us a while will only need to sign new documents when ready as we are familiar with your children's needs. We may call you during this process to update the information we already have.

The new childcare subsidy, and what it means for you

On the 2nd of July, the Australian Government will transition to a new Child Care Subsidy (CCS). This will replace the existing Childcare Rebate (CCR) and Childcare Benefit (CCB).

There are a number of key changes that families who rely on childcare before and/or after school need to know, including:

- Any benefit will be paid directly to child care providers (like Camp Australia), who will then only bill the 'gap' amount to families.
- There will continue to be hardship relief.
- For families earning less than \$186,958, there will no longer be an annual cap on the amount of subsidy you can receive. For families earning between \$186,958 and \$351,248, an increased annual subsidy cap of \$10,000 per child will apply each year.
