## Talk with your children about bystanders

“A bystander is someone who sees the bullying or knows that it is happening to someone else.”

Bullying involves more than the students who are bullied and those who bully others. Bullying often continues because people who are involved do not talk about it and seek help. This includes people who observe bullying – the bystanders. A bystander is someone who sees the bullying or knows that it is happening to someone else.

There may be bystanders who are afraid they may be bullied next and this may influence their decision about what they will do if they see bullying happening. There are different types of bystanders and in this model, they are described as:

**Contributors** – This group offer support to the person bullying, either by helping the person to bully the other person or by encouraging the person bullying. This group might gather to watch the incident (sometimes from concern for the person being bullied, sometimes to see what will happen, and sometimes for enjoyment).

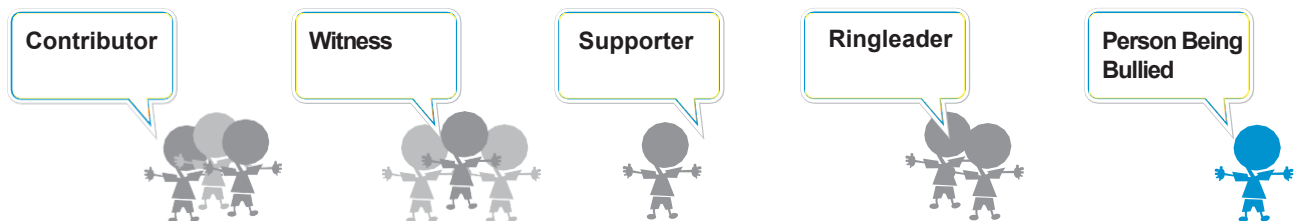
**Supporters** – This group dislikes the bullying, is concerned for the person being bullied and actively tries to help the person being bullied.

### What can bystanders do?

If students see another student being bullied they should:

- Ask a teacher or support person for help
- Let the person doing the bullying know that what they are doing is bullying
- Refuse to join in with the bullying and walk away
- Support the student who is being bullied
- Support their friends and protect them from bullying (children who are alone are more likely to be the target of bullying, so encourage your children to be aware of children who are left out or on their own in the schoolyard).

## Cove wins national competition!

Ocean Shores Public School was excited to hear this week that one of its students, Cove Penfold in Year 5 had won a National Competition run by the ABC. The competition was based on a TV Series 'Back In Time For Dinner', which looked at the way Australian families have changed each decade since the 1950's. Cove's job was to create a presentation covering an aspect of the show.

Cove used his skills with animation to create a very funny but informative piece on the 1950's. He used a program called GoAnimate to create a cartoon based on his family going back in time to the 1950's to eat a typical 1950's meal of tripe. Ara Safarian, the Editor and Community Manager of ABC Education said 'The judges were impressed with all Cove's research and the communication, flow and humour of his video.'

Cove's original video went for 6 minutes, but his challenge was to cut it down to 90 seconds. Cove

decided just to focus on the 1950's as he liked the idea of his dad being the 'king' of the home, although his mum wasn't too happy with the idea that women did roughly 70 hours of housework a week, while men sat in isolation in the lounge room reading the newspaper! Cove won a molecular gastronomy kit as his prize.

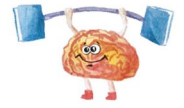
